Portneuf Resource Council CPI Positions

Portneuf Resource Council (PRC) is partnering with the ISU Career Path Internship program again to find a number of paid student interns to fulfill some interesting positions. Once hired students could begin the work immediately. The positions include:

Hosts for the SustainableIdaho radio podcast. PRC is looking for two new hosts to be trained by our current hosts in preparation for taking over either in the summer or at the beginning of the 23-24 school year.

Grant writing position. The intern would find and write a grant that would fund a physical office for the Portneuf Resource Council and create funds for an office manager who will handle PRC's administrative needs.

Journalism student reporter. This intern is interested in reporting on multiple issues related to PRC's sustainability, clean energy and clean water campaigns. These could include topics covered by Sustainable Idaho, local PFAS pollution, our landfill and other water concerns. This person would focus on research, outreach and education in the community. We expect them to write articles that would be published in local newspapers and as blogs on our website.

Summer Research Opportunity - University of Central Florida

HYPER addresses challenges in aerospace travel and energy production, advancing the fundamental knowledge needed to overcome technical barriers limiting hypersonic flight. The 10-week program will be held this summer from May 21st – July 29th, 2023. Participants will gain hands-on research training in challenges such as: utilizing advanced manufacturing techniques for high-value components, integrating in-site monitoring of stress-strain evolution, and more!

We are actively recruiting a diverse group of participants from a variety of universities. These students will:

- Conduct hands-on research guided directly by a faculty mentor and their graduate student(s)
- Interact with a diverse multidisciplinary team of researchers
- Visit the NASA Kennedy Space Center and various aerospace companies
- Participate in professional development workshops
- Gain in-depth training on numerical simulation software ANSYS
- Prepare for graduate school and a research-based career
- Engage with other REU groups located at UCF
